Purpose	People credited with this unit standard are able to explain the life and deeds of a selected wahine Māori and explain the characteristics associated with a selected wahine Māori.

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Guidance Information

- 1 *Tikanga and kawa* – the basic principles underpinning tikanga are common, but while there are some constants, the details of performance of tikanga, and their explanation, may differ. These differences may be at a rohe, iwi, hapū, whānau, or marae level. The context of the learning should include the tikanga of the local mana whenua (if capable) but learning others' tikanga is also encouraged. This is in order to enrich and enhance understanding of tikanga, and the associated reo. *Kawa* are the protocols or customs of the marae (and inside the wharenuī); particularly those related to formal activities such as pōwhiri, karanga, whaikōrero etc. *Kawa* can be particular to marae, and may vary amongst whānau, hapū, and iwi.
- 2 Glossary
Taumau refers to a betrothal or arranged marriage.
Ringa hora – industrious and hospitable
Koi te hinengaro – quick witted
He ārero whakairo kupu – articulate
- 3 For the purposes of this unit standard a *selected wahine Māori* can refer to someone that is/or has been active within the marae, hapū and/or hapori.
- 4 Assessment against this unit standard can be conducted in a number of ways that may include, but is not limited to – oral presentations, visual presentations, written presentations, whakaari, waiata, haka.
- 5 Where applicable, ākonga are encouraged to reference. Referencing will prepare ākonga for academic writing.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Explain the life and deeds of a selected wahine Māori.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Explanation includes three key events associated with the life of a selected wahine Māori.
- Range may include but is not limited to – hui, tangihanga, tohi/iriiri, taumau/tomo, whakawhānau pēpī.
- 1.2 Explanation includes the identification of the areas and iwi where the wahine Māori is known.
- 1.3 Explanation includes two outcomes and effects of the deeds of the wahine Māori.
- Range may include but is not limited to – mahi mō tōna whānau, hapū, iwi, hapori.

Outcome 2

Explain the characteristics associated with a selected wahine Māori.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Explanation includes two characteristics of a selected wahine Māori.
- Range may include but is not limited to – ngākau nui, pukumahi, ngākau mahaki, ringa hora, koi te hinengaro, tū pakari, tū māia, he ārero whakairo kupu.
