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### Guidance Information

- 1 Tikanga and kawa related to the content of the Whakairo Sub-Field refer to specific interpretations and understandings of whakapapa, te reo, symbolism, concepts and representation within a Whakairo context. They are distinctive from those within the broader context of Te Ao Māori.
- 2 *Contemporary conservation practices* are those outlined by the Department of Conservation regulations available at <http://www.doc.govt.nz>.
- 3 Legislation relevant to this unit standard includes but is not limited to the Conservation Act 1987, Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga Act 2014, Reserves Act 1977, Resource Management Act 1991, and Te Ture Whenua Māori Act 1993.

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### Outcomes and performance criteria

#### Outcome 1

Examine conservation practices used for environmental resources.

Range three plant resources, one animal.

#### Performance criteria

- 1.1 Traditional conservation practices are examined and developed in a manner ensuring rites and customs are maintained.

Range rites and customs include but are not limited to – mauri, tapu, rāhui kaitiakitanga.

- 1.2 Traditional conservation practices are examined and developed in a manner ensuring resource availability and sustainability.

1.3 Contemporary conservation practices are observed and developed to maintain resource availability.

Range Department of Conservation regulations, Resource Management Act 1991.

**Outcome 2**

Propagate resources as a conservation practice.

Range three plant resources.

**Performance criteria**

2.1 Resources are propagated in a manner ensuring conservation of rare species.

**Outcome 3**

Harvest whakairo resources sustainably using conservation practices.

Range plant resource, animal resource.

**Performance criteria**

3.1 Resource availability is quantified to ensure stocks are maintained.

Range scarce, plentiful.

3.2 Alternative materials are selected in a manner ensuring sustainable management of stock.

Range natural, manufactured.

3.3 Resources are selectively harvested in a manner ensuring stocks are not depleted.

Range age of stock, location, amount taken, frequency of harvest.

3.4 Regulations and tikanga are observed in a manner ensuring resources are protected.

Range rāhui and iwi tikanga and Department of Conservation regulations.
