Outcome 2

Resolve the architectural space of the pātaka.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Organisation of pātaka components are considered to ensure architectural structure that concurs with Māori architectural models.

Range tekoteko, koruru, maihi, raparapa, amo, kuwaha, paepae, epa, tāhūhū, pane, heke, pou.

Outcome 3

Resolve the architectural space of the waka.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Organisation of waka components are considered to ensure architectural structure that concurs with Māori architectural models.

Range tauihu, taurapa, kei, parata, taumana, rauawa, takere, riu, paparewa.
