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Outcome 2

Prepare and maintain drawing tools to create design.

Range may include but is not limited to – pencil, chalk, charcoal, chalk line, chisel.

Performance criteria

2.1 Tools are prepared in a manner ensuring that scribing marks will accord with traditional toi Māori examples.

Range template and/or freehand.

2.2 Tools are maintained to ensure precision of line or cut.

Outcome 3

Employ reproduction techniques.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Mark is applied to surface in a manner ensuring guidelines can be followed.
- 3.2 Mark is applied to surface to ensure guideline is not blurred or fuzzy.
- 3.3 Mark is applied to surface to ensure rendering accords with traditional toi Māori examples.
- 3.4 Mark is applied to surface in a manner ensuring orthographic clarity and accuracy of reproduction.

Range may include but is not limited to – pencil, pen, charcoal, chalk, chisel.
