Definitions

Concrete industry drawings can include shop drawings, working drawings, production drawings, contract drawings, and reinforcing plans.

Specifications refer to documented instructions (oral, written, graphic) and may include any of the following: manufacturer's specifications, recommendations or technical data sheets; material specifications; specifications from a specialist source such as an architect, designer, engineer or a supervisor; site or work specific requirements.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Read and interpret concrete industry drawings and specifications.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Concrete industry drawings and specifications are identified and described in terms of their types and uses, and the relationship between end product and construction is explained.
- 1.2 Abbreviations and symbols are identified and interpreted in terms of their use on concrete industry drawings and specifications.
- 1.3 Any preliminary work is identified from concrete industry drawings and specifications used in own workplace.
- 1.4 Quality and types of materials are determined from concrete industry drawings and specifications used in own workplace.
