<b>Purpose</b>	A person credited with this standard can make a template for cutting glass.
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<b>Classification</b>	Construction Trades > Glazing
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<b>Available grade</b>	Achieved
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### Guidance Information

#### 1 Assessment

This unit standard must be assessed under the supervision of a commercially competent glass or glazing practitioner in workplace conditions that reflect:

- current health, safety, industry, and workplace requirements; and
- industry requirements for commercially acceptable timeframes.

Evidence generated for assessment against this standard must be verified by a person who has current expertise in the glass and glazing trades and has had the opportunity to regularly observe the candidate in the workplace.

- #### 2
- Work must be completed without injury to personnel or damage to products and equipment. Personal protective equipment must be used to meet regulatory and worksite requirements.

#### 3 Definitions

*Personal protective equipment* includes – anything used or worn by a person (including clothing) to minimise risks to the person's health and safety.

*Worksite requirements* refer to instructions to staff on policy and procedures which are documented in manual format and are available in the workplace. These requirements include – company specifications and procedures, work instructions, manufacturer's specifications, product quality specifications, legislative requirements.

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### Outcomes and performance criteria

#### Outcome 1

Make a template for cutting glass.

## Performance criteria

- 1.1 Prepare the work area and select and prepare any required tools, plant, and equipment.
- Range identify hazards, check ventilation, clear and clean work area, undertake any required safety precautions.
- 1.2 Select materials for the template according to the job specifications.
- 1.3 Identify variances and include them in the calculations to ensure final measurements meet the job specifications.
- 1.4 Design and produce the template to meet the job specifications.
- 1.5 Cut and record the template.
- 1.6 Check the completed template against the job specifications and remedy any inconsistencies.
