- 2 This unit standard is for people working in the garment manufacturing industry.
- 3 Definitions
Product, style or garment specifications are all terms for the same document. The terminology varies between workplaces but they all refer to the documentation that accompanies each manufacturing order. This documentation sets out the material to be used for the garment, the size range for manufacturing, the product assembly sequence, product finishing procedures and the component specifications.
Workplace procedures refer to the verbal or documented procedures for performing work activities and include health and safety, operational, environmental, and quality management requirements. They may refer to manuals, manufacturer's specifications, codes of practice, or policy statements.

Elements and performance criteria

Element 1

Demonstrate knowledge of the fastenings and decorative attachments used on garments.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Fastenings and attachments are identified and described in terms of their use.
Range types used in the workplace.

Element 2

Attach a button to a garment.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Buttons are selected to match the garment specifications.
2.2 Button is aligned with the buttonhole.
2.3 Button shank conforms to garment specifications.
Range hand, metal/plastic.
2.4 Cotton ends are secured and cut.

Element 3

Attach domes, studs, eyelets and decorative attachments to a garment.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Attachment is located symmetrically and according to garment specifications.
3.2 Attachment tools are selected and used according to workplace procedures.
3.3 Attachment is fully secured to the garment.

Please note

Providers must be accredited by NZQA, or an inter-institutional body with delegated authority for quality assurance, before they can report credits from assessment against unit standards or deliver courses of study leading to that assessment.

Industry Training Organisations must be accredited by NZQA before they can register credits from assessment against unit standards.
