1.2 Accessories are checked as appropriate for task and serviceable.

Range may include but is not limited to – carry pouch, belts, clips, sash

straps, lapel microphone.

Outcome 2

Use hand-held radios for two-way communications in a construction or related context.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Communication channels are selected and checked as free for use.
- 2.2 Communications are clear.

Range may include but is not limited to – use of talk button, audibility,

enunciation, user identification, appropriate language.

2.3 Constant talk method is maintained during safety critical operations or as required by workplace procedures.

Outcome 3

Store hand-held radios ready for use.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Radios are confirmed as switched off and charged.
- 3.2 Radios are stored according to manufacturers' instructions and workplace procedures.
