Range physical – amputees (congenital loss of limb and acquired), spinal cord injuries, acquired head injury, cerebral palsy, spina bifida or hydrocephalus; intellectual – Down syndrome, autistic spectrum disorders, fragile X syndrome; sensory – hearing impaired, sight impaired.

#### **Performance criteria**

- 1.1 Describe medical conditions in terms of their signs or symptoms.
- 1.2 Describe medical conditions in terms of their implications and precautions for coaching equestrian athletes.

## Outcome 2

Describe organisations that provide equestrian competitions for people with medical conditions.

Range organisations include but are not limited to – Para-Equestrian, Special Olympics.

### Performance criteria

- 2.1 Describe organisations in terms of their classification systems.
- 2.2 Describe organisations in terms of the competition opportunities that they offer.

### Outcome 3

Describe the purpose, fitting, and criteria for use of compensating aids used in Para-Equestrian competition.

Range compensating aids include but are not limited to those related to – saddles, stirrups, bridles or reins, whips, riding attire; posture, postural supports and orthoses; evidence of at least three compensating aids is required.

### Performance criteria

- 3.1 Describe the purpose and fitting of compensating aids in accordance with Federation Equestre Internationale regulations.
- 3.2 Describe the criteria for compensating aids in accordance with Federation Equestre Internationale regulations.
