Workplace procedures are all authorised instructions, processes and work practices carried out in the workshop, factory, shop and worksite.
- 3 Range
Special resin flooring applications may include but are not limited to composition, purpose and performance of – waterproofing, conductive flooring, moisture barriers, chemical resistance flooring, synthetic terrazzo, comfort flooring, sports flooring, decking, decorative stone flooring;
evidence of a minimum of five is required.

Demonstrate knowledge of special resin applications.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Composition, purpose and performance of special resin applications is described in accordance with manufacturer's specifications.

- 1.2 Benefits, drawbacks and limitations of using special resin applications are described in accordance with manufacturer's specifications and workplace procedures.

Range benefits, drawbacks and limitations may include but are not limited to – aesthetic appeal, longevity, space and traffic considerations, conductivity, hygiene, slip resistance, hardness, capability.
