- 2 Definition
Workplace procedures are all authorised instructions, processes and work practices carried out in the workshop, factory, shop and worksite.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of preparing timber, composite, and metal substrates in the flooring industry.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Materials and equipment required for the job are identified in terms of the floor condition and the type of substrate being prepared.

Range evidence is required for timber, composite, and metal substrates.
- 1.2 The process for preparing a substrate for covering on timber floors is described in accordance with workplace procedures.

- 1.3 The process for preparing a substrate for covering on composite floors is described in accordance with workplace procedures.
- 1.4 The process for preparing a substrate for covering on metal surfaces is described in accordance with workplace procedures.
