<b>Purpose</b>	People credited with this unit standard are able to explain the deeds and roles of Māui in accordance with ngā kōrero tuku iho, and how these have influenced iwi.

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### Guidance Information

- 1 Local iwi versions of kōrero relating to Māui are encouraged, where applicable.
- 2 Evidence may be presented in a number of ways that may include, but are not limited to – oral presentations, visual presentations, written presentations, whakaari, waiata, haka.
- 3 *Ngā kōrero tuku iho* are Māori stories, or histories, which provide a basis or rationale for Māori belief systems and tikanga. They may be found in Māori oral traditions (such as pūrākau, pakiwaitara, whakapapa, waiata, karanga, or whaikōrero) or in written works. They may also be particular to a marae, whānau, hapū, rohe, or iwi; and are often revered as treasured accounts to be passed down the generations.

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### Outcomes and performance criteria

#### Outcome 1

Explain the deeds and roles of Māui in accordance with ngā kōrero tuku iho.

#### Performance criteria

- 1.1 The deeds of Māui are explained.

Range	deeds may include but are not limited to – activities, accomplishments, conduct; evidence of two is required.
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1.2 The roles of Māui are explained.

Range roles may include but are not limited to – position, function, responsibility, pioneer, innovator, non-conformist, risk taker, challenger;  
evidence of two is required.

## Outcome 2

Explain how the deeds and roles of Māui have influenced iwi

### Performance criteria

2.1 How Māui's deeds and roles have influenced iwi are explained in terms of whakapapa and rangatiratanga.

Range may include but is not limited to – tuakana/teina, pōtiki, confidence, self-reliance, leadership, determination;  
evidence of one for each of whakapapa and rangatiratanga is required.

2.2 How Māui's deeds and roles have influenced iwi are explained in terms of manaakitanga and whanaungatanga.

Range may include but is not limited to – kindness, friendship, caring, developing relationships, bearing responsibility for self and others;  
evidence of one for each of manaakitanga and whanaungatanga is required.

2.3 How Māui's deeds and roles have influenced iwi are explained within the context of innovation.

Range may include but is not limited to – multi-tasking, analytical thinking, lateral thinking, risk taking, strategic planning, cunningness;  
evidence of two is required.
