Purpose	People credited with this unit standard are able to identify and explain the concepts of whānau, hapū and iwi in accordance with tikanga.

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Guidance Information

- 1 *Tikanga* are cultural practices and procedures exercised by Māori in their daily lives. These practices reflect the concepts upon which they are based and provide guidelines for appropriate behaviour in Māori society. They also prescribe consequences for any breaches or when tikanga is not followed. They can be particular to a marae, whānau, hapū, rohe, or iwi.
- 2 The basic principles underpinning tikanga are common, but while there are some constants, the details of performance of tikanga, and their explanation, may differ. These differences may be at a rohe, iwi, hapū, whānau, or marae level. The context of the learning should include the tikanga of the local mana whenua (if capable), but learning others' tikanga is also encouraged. This is in order to enrich and enhance understanding of tikanga, and the associated reo.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Identify the concepts of whānau, hapū and iwi in accordance with tikanga.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Ngā atua and their importance in determining the concepts of whānau, hapū and iwi are identified.
- 1.2 Whakapapa and its importance in determining whānau, hapū and iwi is identified.
- 1.3 The status of eponymous ancestors for whānau, hapū and iwi is identified.

Outcome 2

Explain the concepts of whānau, hapū and iwi in accordance with tikanga.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 How and why atua become the basis for the concepts of whānau, hapū and iwi is explained.
- 2.2 The status of eponymous ancestors and their impact on the concepts of whānau, hapū and iwi are explained.
