Explanatory notes

Definition

Tikanga are cultural practices and procedures exercised by Māori in their daily lives. These practices reflect the concepts upon which they are based and provide guidelines for appropriate behaviour in Māori society. They also prescribe consequences for any breaches or when tikanga is not followed. They can be particular to a local marae, whānau, hapū, or iwi.

Outcomes and evidence requirements

Outcome 1

Explain the practices associated with tuku wairua in a customary context and in accordance with tikanga.

- 1.1 Ngau taringa is explained in terms of tuku wairua.
- 1.2 Ngau i te timuaki is explained in terms of tuku wairua.

- 1.4 Reasons for the practices are explained in terms of tuku wairua.

Range one reason for each of – ngau taringa, ngau i te timuaki, ngau i te kōnui.

Outcome 2

Explain the practices associated with tuku wairua in a contemporary context and in accordance with tikanga.

Evidence requirements

- 2.1 Hiki tapu is explained in terms of tuku wairua.
- 2.2 Karakia is explained in terms of tuku wairua.
- 2.3 Last rites are explained in terms of tuku wairua.
- 2.4 Reasons for the practices are explained in terms of tuku wairua.
- Range one reason for each of – hiki tapu, karakia, last rites.
