Purpose	People credited with this unit standard are able to: weigh and dispense concrete mix components for prescribed mixes; mix and discharge concrete; and complete work operations for concrete pipe manufacture.

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Explanatory notes

- 1 Definition
Workplace practice refers to the documented procedures specific to a workplace which set out the standard and required practices of that workplace.
- 2 Evidence for this unit standard must comply with industry practice. *Industry practice* refers to the ability to demonstrate knowledge and skills that reflect the productivity, uniformity, finish quality and material economies currently accepted within industry.
- 3 Legislation and publications relevant to this unit standard include:
Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992 and Health and Safety in Employment Regulations 1995;
NZS 3104:2003 *Specification for concrete production*; NZS 3111:1986 *Methods of test for water and aggregate for concrete*; and NZS 3121:1986 *Specification for water and aggregate for concrete*, available from Standards NZ (<http://www.standards.co.nz>).

Outcomes and evidence requirements

Outcome 1

Weigh and dispense concrete mix components for prescribed mixes for concrete pipe manufacture.

Evidence requirements

- 1.1 Concrete mix components are selected to achieve the prescribed mix design.

Range components – cement, sand, aggregate, admixtures, additives, water.

- 1.2 Concrete mix components are dispensed into weigh hoppers or gauge boxes and mixing bowl in accordance with workplace practice.

Outcome 2

Mix and discharge concrete for concrete pipe manufacture.

Evidence requirements

- 2.1 Equipment is verified as complying with tolerances in accordance with workplace practice.
- 2.2 Concrete mixing equipment is cleaned and operated in accordance with workplace practice.
- 2.3 Mix is discharged in accordance with workplace practice.

Outcome 3

Complete work operations.

Evidence requirements

- 3.1 All operations are safely completed, workplace and equipment are cleaned in accordance with workplace practice and environmental safety requirements, and routine maintenance is carried out in accordance with workplace practice.
- 3.2 All documentation is completed in accordance with workplace practice.
