Purpose	This is an introductory unit standard for people in the primary sector who prepare and apply agrichemicals under supervision.
	People credited with this unit standard are able to prepare and apply agrichemicals using hand held equipment; and dispose of surplus mix, decontaminate, clean and store equipment, and complete documentation.

- 4 Definitions

Agrichemical – any substance, whether inorganic or organic, man-made or naturally occurring, modified or in its original state, that is used to eradicate, modify or control flora and fauna. It is a subset of agricultural compounds and includes pesticides, spray additives, fertilisers, vertebrate pest control products, and oral nutrition products.

Hand held agrichemical application equipment may include but is not limited to – motorised or non motorised knapsack, weed wiper, hand held mist blower, lawn boy sprayer.

Workplace procedures – the verbal or written instructions to staff on the procedures for the worksite, equipment, and documentation.

5 Assessment

This unit standard must be assessed in a commercial workplace or simulated commercial workplace situation.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Prepare to apply agrichemicals using hand held equipment.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Select personal protective equipment according to agrichemical requirements, and fit and use in accordance with NZS 8409:2004, and legislation.
- 1.2 Prepare agrichemicals in accordance with NZS 8409:2004 and workplace procedures.
 - Range preparation measurement, mixing.
- 1.3 Prepare agrichemical application equipment in accordance with NZS 8409:2004, and manufacturer's specifications.

Range includes but is not limited to – clean, leak free, droplet size for target and/or conditions.

Outcome 2

Apply agrichemicals using hand held equipment.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Apply agrichemicals at the required rate in accordance with label requirements, and NZS 8409:2004.
- 2.2 Apply agrichemicals on target, avoiding off target spray drift in accordance with NZS 8409:2004.

Outcome 3

Dispose of surplus mix, decontaminate, clean and store equipment, and complete documentation.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Dispose of surplus mix in accordance with NZS 8409:2004.
- 3.2 Decontaminate, clean and store, or dispose of, equipment associated with agrichemical application, in accordance with NZS 8409:2004.

Range equipment – personal, application.

- 3.3 Complete documentation relating to agrichemical use in accordance with NZS 8409:2004.
 - Range may include but is not limited to spray diary, record of weather conditions, tracking systems.
