- 1.2 Biosecurity threats prevention is explained in accordance with workplace policies and procedures.
- 1.3 Hull fouling control methods are described in accordance with the Marine Biosecurity Guide.

Outcome 2

Demonstrate knowledge of dumping waste and discharges from vessels in marina operation.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 The requirements for dumping of waste are explained in accordance with MPR relevant regulations in relation to marina operation.
- 2.2 Discharge regulations are explained in accordance with part 3 of the Resource Management (Marine Pollution) Regulations 1998.
 - Range oil, noxious liquids, sewage, rubbish, ballast water.

Outcome 3

Demonstrate knowledge of environmental control facilities in marinas.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Waste disposal facilities are described in accordance with the requirements of MARPOL.
- 3.2 Recycling facilities are described in accordance with local authority rules.
- 3.3 Toilet and sewage pump out facilities are described in terms of their operation and how they reduce pollution.
- 3.4 Oil disposal facilities are described in accordance with marina operational procedures and the Resource Management Act 1991.

Outcome 4

Demonstrate knowledge of the Resource Management Act 1991 section 15 in relation to marina operations.

Performance criteria

4.1 The role of local authorities is described in terms of their responsibility to administer the Resource Management Act 1991.

4.2 The Resource Management Act 1991 section 15 is explained in terms of impacts on marina operations.
