2.1 The site is reconnoitred by day to identify all hazards.

Range hazards include but are not limited to – buildings and other structures, wires, trees, steep ground.

2.2 Pre-flight consultation is completed.

Range may include but is not limited to – requirements of employer, communications with staff on the ground, identification of areas at risk of frost.

- 2.3 The height of the inversion layer is determined by means of an outside air temperature gauge.
- 2.4 The correct height and power setting for operations are determined in terms of all up weight and the height of the inversion layer.

Outcome 3

Demonstrate low level helicopter night-flying operations for frost protection.

Performance criteria

3.1 Low level night flying for frost protection is demonstrated.

Range includes but is not limited to – situational awareness, appropriate height, appropriate power setting.
