Purpose	<p>This entry-level unit standard is for people working in a catering services operation.</p> <p>People credited with this unit standard are able to package prepared catering items, and transport prepared catering items, for a catering services operation.</p>

Outcomes and evidence requirements

Outcome 1

Package prepared catering items for a catering services operation.

Evidence requirements

- 1.1 Food is checked to ensure it is suitable for packaging, storage and transportation in accordance with establishment requirements.

 Range checked includes but is not limited to – quality, shelf-life, microbiological condition, portion control.
- 1.2 Packaging materials are selected to meet specific food, storage and transport requirements in accordance with establishment requirements.

1.3 Food is packaged and labelled in accordance with establishment requirements.

Outcome 2

Transport prepared catering items for a catering services operation.

Evidence requirements

- 2.1 Food transportation vehicles are selected for the type of food being transported in accordance with establishment requirements.
- 2.2 Food is transported safely and hygienically in accordance with establishment and legislative requirements.
- 2.3 Transportation records are maintained in accordance with establishment requirements.
