*Comprehensively describe a social process* means to describe in-depth a social process, including the role norms and values play in shaping the process. The description must be supported with a comprehensive range of appropriate evidence and examples.

Social processes are the means through which individual and social identities and relationships are shaped. They may include but are not limited to socialisation, stratification, and globalisation.
