Purpose	This unit standard is for people working in the drycleaning industry. People credited with this unit standard are able to finish textile items.

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Explanatory notes

- Evidence must meet the following legislative requirements:

Privacy Act 1993.
- Definitions
Enterprise – an organisation where training and/or assessment is taking place and/or where the trainee is employed.
Enterprise procedures – actions which comply with the policies, systems, and directives in a particular enterprise. Enterprise procedures must comply with the requirements of the Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992, and subsequent amendments.
Finishing processes include –using an ironer, dryfolding, using a tunnel finisher to carry out the pressing required to finish the drycleaning process. Equipment used to undertake finishing will vary depending on item type and construction, and equipment available in the enterprise.

Outcomes and evidence requirements

Outcome 1

Finish textile items.

Range trousers, jacket, skirt, dress, shirt or blouse.

Evidence requirements

- Orders are prioritised according to enterprise procedures.

- 1.2 Textile items are prepared for finishing according to garment requirements.
- 1.3 Finishing process is carried out to match restrictions of garment and fabric type and achieve finish according to enterprise procedures.
- Range fabric composition, fabric construction, garment construction.
- 1.4 Quality checks are applied according to enterprise procedures.
- 1.5 Finished item is placed in production line for packaging according to textile requirements.
- 1.6 Documentation is completed according to enterprise procedures.
