Outcomes and evidence requirements

Outcome 1

Identify cleaning products for different tasks.

Evidence requirements

- 1.1 Cleaning products which are used for common cleaning tasks are identified.

Range may include but is not limited to cleaning products used on – hard floor surfaces, wooden floors, carpets, metal surfaces, mirror or glass, food bench tops, soft furnishings, wooden surfaces, painted surfaces, toilets or urinals, basins.
Evidence of seven is required.

- 1.2 The advantages of three commonly used cleaning products are explained.
- 1.3 Safety risks associated with three commonly used cleaning products are explained with reference to the Material Data Sheets.

Outcome 2

Use commonly used cleaning agents.

Evidence requirements

- 2.1 Cleaning products are used in accordance with organisational requirements and manufacturer directions.

Range evidence is required for three commonly used cleaning products.
