

<b>Title</b>	<b>Complete underwater search and recovery scuba dives in open water</b>

<b>Purpose</b>	People credited with this unit standard are able to: describe search and recovery diving; and plan and complete underwater search and recovery scuba dives in open water to locate an object.
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<b>Classification</b>	Diving > Diving - Recreational
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<b>Available grade</b>	Achieved
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<b>Prerequisites</b>	<p>A current fit to dive medical clearance signed by a physician.</p> <p>An entry-level certification from a recognised dive training agency.</p> <p>Unit 28392, <i>Scuba dive in open water to a maximum depth of 18 metres</i>, or demonstrate equivalent knowledge and skills.</p>

- 1 All learning and assessment leading to this unit standard must be carried out in accordance with the following as relevant:

- 2 Definitions
 

*Dive plan* refers to the procedures by which the accredited dive provider's diving operations are implemented for all dives required to meet this standard.

*Industry technical and safety criteria* refer to dive instruction, supervision and performance being carried out in accordance with the standards, procedures and training materials of the respective dive training agency. The agency must meet or exceed the World Recreational Scuba Training Council training standards.

*Open water* is any natural body of water realistic of local diving conditions in terms of water movement, temperature, visibility, depth and aquatic life.

## Outcomes and performance criteria

### Outcome 1

Describe search and recovery diving.

#### Performance criteria

- 1.1 Describe planning in relation to search and recovery diving.
- 1.2 Describe underwater search patterns and techniques using a compass.
- 1.3 Describe underwater search patterns and techniques using ropes and rope signals.
- 1.4 Describe underwater object recovery methods and procedures.
- 1.5 Describe potential search and recovery diving hazards.
- 1.6 Describe planning in relation to search and recovery diving.

### Outcome 2

Plan and complete underwater search and recovery scuba dives in open water to locate an object.

#### Performance criteria

- 2.1 Plan and prepare for underwater search and recovery dives.
- 2.2 Complete underwater search and recovery dives in accordance with the dive plan.
- 2.3 Demonstrate search and recovery dive skills.
