## 2 Definitions

Assessment refers to the candidate instructor's assessment of trainee supervisor's applying industry technical and safety criteria to a group of clients. A group is considered to be a minimum of two people.

Clients refer to individuals who are certified as open water divers.

Dive plan refers to the procedures by which the accredited dive provider's diving operations are implemented for all dives required to meet this standard. Industry technical and safety criteria refer to dive instruction, supervision and performance being carried out in accordance with the standards, procedures and training materials of the respective dive training agency. The agency must meet or exceed the World Recreational Scuba Training Council training standards. Instruction refers to the candidate instructor's act of imparting knowledge or skills as per industry technical and safety criteria.

Occupational diving refers to diving performed in the course of employment for gain or reward.

Open water is any natural body of water realistic of local diving conditions in terms of water movement, temperature, visibility, depth and aquatic life.

Supervision refers to:

- direct supervision the candidate instructor's personal observation and interaction
  with trainee supervisors and the trainees interaction with the clients including
  accompanying the trainees and their clients underwater.
- indirect supervision the candidate instructor being present at the dive site, but is not personally accompanying the trainee supervisors and their clients underwater but is prepared to come to their aid.
- 3 Assessment against this unit standard may be undertaken in simulated conditions.

Instruct and assess trainee supervisors' knowledge of best practice occupational dive operation standards.

Instruct and assess trainee supervisors' knowledge of supervising and controlling certified divers.

#### Performance criteria

2.1 Instruct and assess trainee supervisors on knowledge of supervision, group management and control techniques in diving.

#### **Outcome 3**

Instruct and assess trainee supervisors' knowledge of dive trip logistics.

Range shore or boat based dive trips.

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#### Performance criteria

3.1 Instruct and assess trainee supervisors on knowledge of the planning, preparation and logistics for dive trips.

#### **Outcome 4**

Instruct and assess trainee supervisors' knowledge of planning and managing a dive trip.

## Performance criteria

4.1 Instruct and assess trainee supervisors on knowledge of planning and managing a dive trip.

Range trip organisation, logistics, record keeping.

## **Outcome 5**

Instruct and assess trainee supervisors' planning and preparation for supervision and control of clients on an underwater tour.

## Performance criteria

5.1 Instruct and assess trainee supervisors on dive planning, preparation and establishment of dive parameters in advance of supervision and control of clients on an underwater tour.

## **Outcome 6**

Instruct and assess trainee supervisors' guiding of clients on scuba dives in open water.

#### Performance criteria

- 6.1 Instruct and assess trainee supervisors on the guiding of clients on an underwater tour in open water.
- 6.2 Instruct and assess trainee supervisors on post dive procedures.
