2 Definitions

Corrective action plan – identifies non-conformance, corrective actions, date by which action must be taken, and any other follow up requirements.

Information – information collected from interviews, observation, review of workplace records, and accessing relevant technical information.

Organisational requirements – instructions to staff on policies and procedures which are documented in memo, electronic or manual format and are available in the workplace.

Primary products food processing operation – covers a meat, dairy, seafood, fruit and vegetable and honey processing, food and beverage manufacturing, and other related industries.

Stakeholders – auditee, supervisor, manager, company manager, regulatory authority, customer, factory staff, other appropriate people or departments.

3 This unit standard applies to both internal and external audits. While the scope of the internal and external audit might differ, the audit processes used will be similar.

4 Evidence for the practical components of this unit standard must be supplied from the workplace.

5 All evidence presented in this unit standard must be in accordance with organisational requirements.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Participate in planning an audit for a primary products food processing operation.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Identify roles and responsibilities of people participating in the audit.
- 1.2 Identify the purpose and scope of the audit.
- 1.3 Identify information and resources required to conduct the audit.

Outcome 2

Participate in an audit for a primary products food processing operation.

Range audits may include but are not limited to – product safety plans, ACC partnership safety audits, and good manufacturing requirements.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Collect information that is adequate, representative, and meets audit requirements.
- 2.2 Analyse information to assess adequacy of performance against audit criteria
- 2.3 Review records to confirm compliance against audit criteria.
- 2.4 Observe compliance against audit criteria in the workplace.
- 2.5 Identify areas requiring corrective action.

Outcome 3

Participate in the reporting and follow up processes for a primary products food processing operation.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Identify and report situations presenting an imminent and serious risk to the process objectives.
- 3.2 Prepare audit reports to address the identified scope.

- 3.3 Communicate results of the audit to stakeholders.
- 3.4 Develop a corrective action plan.
- 3.5 Gather evidence to verify identified corrective actions have been completed as agreed.
 - Range evidence of three actions is required.
- 3.6 Identify any corrective actions not completed, negotiate a new target date, and follow up corrective actions.
