products characterised by unusual or non-standard angles and dimensions.

## Outcomes and performance criteria

#### Outcome 1

Prepare to repair non-standard architectural aluminium joinery products.

#### Performance criteria

- 1.1 Area to be repaired is checked against client requirements.
  - Range requirements may include timing of repair, requirements and availability of any scaffolding or hoisting arrangements, availability of any sub-contracted personnel.
- 1.2 Repair options are communicated and agreed with the client in accordance with company procedures.
- 1.3 Materials and equipment required for the repair are prepared in accordance with company procedures.
- 1.4 Any sub-contracted personnel required for the work are confirmed in accordance with company procedures.

#### Outcome 2

Repair non-standard architectural aluminium joinery products.

#### Performance criteria

2.1 Sash is checked to ensure compatibility with the repair specifications.

Range checking includes – size, measurements, configuration, colour.

- 2.2 Profile is matched to ensure compatibility with the repair specifications.
- 2.3 Repair is completed in accordance with company procedures and client requirements.
- 2.4 Completed repair is checked to ensure it meets client requirements and any relevant industry standards requirements.
- 2.5 Any documentation and inspections are completed in accordance with company procedures and client requirements.
