

<b>Title</b>	<b>Blow wave short hair into complex styles</b>

<b>Purpose</b>	<p>This unit standard is for people in the hairdressing industry wishing to further develop their blow drying skills.</p> <p>People credited with this unit standard are able to: prepare to blow wave and blow wave short hair into complex styles; and complete follow-up actions.</p>

<b>Recommended skills and knowledge</b>	Unit 2870, <i>Blow dry hair into elementary styles</i> , or demonstrate equivalent knowledge and skills.

## Explanatory notes

- Definitions**

*Legislative requirements* refer to the obligations of the employer and/or employee under the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 and Health (Hairdressers) Regulations 1980.

*Workplace requirements* mean the practices prescribed by management as being the quality standards for client contact and work organisation for a particular salon.

*Complex styles* refer to any style requiring a combination of direction, curl and movement in the hair. This excludes styles included in Unit 2870, *Blow dry hair into elementary styles*.
- In this unit standard all work must comply with legislative requirements and must ensure optimum hair condition and maximum client comfort at all times.

## Outcomes and evidence requirements

### Outcome 1

Prepare to blow wave short hair into complex styles.

### **Evidence requirements**

- 1.1 Consultation with the client identifies and confirms work needed.
- 1.2 The hair and scalp are analysed.
- Range porosity, elasticity, texture, density, length, scalp condition, growth patterns.
- 1.3 The style to be blow dried is selected in accordance with confirmed outcome and compatibility with hair and scalp analysis.
- 1.4 The client is protected against water and/or product spillage.
- 1.5 Tools are selected to meet the requirements of the selected style.
- Range a minimum of two different sized radial brushes, one of which must be no more than 2cm in diameter.
- 1.6 Hair is prepared for blow drying in accordance with hair and scalp analysis, product instructions and confirmed outcome.
- Range hydrogen bonds broken.

### **Outcome 2**

Blow wave short hair into complex styles.

### **Evidence requirements**

- 2.1 Styling products are selected and applied to hair in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions, hair analysis, and service requirements.
- 2.2 Excess moisture is removed by par-drying the hair.
- 2.3 Hair is blow dried to meet confirmed outcome and to leave hair in optimum condition.
- 2.4 Dried hair is dressed and finished to meet the confirmed outcome and to ensure maximum hair protection.
- 2.5 Blow wave is completed within thirty minutes.

### **Outcome 3**

Complete follow-up actions.

### **Evidence requirements**

3.1 Home haircare advice provided is consistent with client's hair type and completed service.

Range product type, hair maintenance.

3.2 Tools and equipment are sanitised in accordance with workplace requirements.

3.3 The work area is cleaned and tidied in accordance with workplace requirements.

Range work area – shampoo area, styling station.
