

Title	Complete elementary colour corrections for hair

Purpose	<p>This unit standard is for people in the hairdressing industry who wish to develop knowledge and skills in completing elementary colour corrections for hair.</p> <p>People credited with this unit standard are able to: demonstrate knowledge of elementary colour correction for hair; remove aniline derivative tint from hair; and counteract unwanted colour reflect.</p>

Recommended skills and knowledge	Unit 19791, <i>Select and apply midway hair colour</i> ; and Unit 19792, <i>Select and apply permanent hair colour</i> , or demonstrate equivalent knowledge and skills.

Explanatory notes

- 1 Definitions
Following service may include but is not limited to – haircut, blow wave.
Legislative requirements refer to the obligations of the employer and/or employee under the Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992 and Health (Hairdressers) Regulations 1980.
- 2 In this unit standard all work must comply with legislative requirements and must ensure optimum hair condition and maximum client comfort at all times.
- 3 The requirements of outcomes 2 and 3 cannot be met during the same service. They require two separate services.

Outcomes and evidence requirements

Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of elementary colour correction for hair.

Range removal of aniline derivative tint, correction of unwanted colour reflect.

Evidence requirements

- 1.1 How to determine the type of colour correction required for hair is described.
- 1.2 The methods for undertaking elementary colour correction for hair are described in terms of the desired outcome and compatibility with results of hair and scalp analyses.

Outcome 2

Remove aniline derivative tint from hair.

Evidence requirements

- 2.1 Consultation with the client identifies and confirms work needed.
- 2.2 The hair and scalp are analysed.
Range visual and physical hair analysis and/or decomposition test.
- 2.3 Process selected is suitable for the desired outcome and compatible with hair and scalp analysis.
Range maximum removal of aniline derivative tint, maximum hair protection.
- 2.4 The client is protected against water and/or chemical spillage.
- 2.5 Hair is prepared in accordance with manufacturer's instructions and selected process, and to ensure maximum hair condition.
Range includes but is not limited to – maximum hair protection.
- 2.6 The selected chemicals are mixed and applied to hair in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.
Range maximum removal of aniline derivative tint, minimum hair damage.
- 2.7 The process is monitored in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.
- 2.8 The chemicals are removed from hair in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.
- 2.9 Hair is prepared for following service.
Range may include but is not limited to – towel dried, combed, product applied.
- 2.10 Home haircare advice provided is consistent with hair type and completed service.

Range product type, hair maintenance.

2.11 Record card is filled out in accordance with workplace requirements.

Range client details, completed service, advice provided.

2.12 Tools and equipment are sanitised in accordance with workplace requirements.

2.13 The work area is cleaned and tidied in accordance with workplace requirements.

Range work area – shampoo area, styling station, dispensary.

Outcome 3

Counteract unwanted colour reflect.

Range counteract any one of – gold, red, orange, green, ash, yellow, violet.

Evidence requirements

3.1 Consultation with the client identifies and confirms work needed.

3.2 The hair and scalp are analysed.

Range visual and physical hair analysis and/or decomposition test.

3.3 Process selected is suitable for the desired outcome and compatible with hair and scalp analysis.

Range correct unwanted colour reflect, maximum hair protection.

3.4 The client is protected against water and/or chemical spillage.

3.5 Hair is prepared in accordance with manufacturer's instructions and selected process, and to ensure maximum hair condition.

Range includes but is not limited to – maximum hair protection.

3.6 Counteractive colour is mixed as required in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.

3.7 Counteractive colour is applied in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.

3.8 Processing is monitored to counteract unwanted colour reflect and to leave hair in optimum condition.

3.9 Product residue is removed from hair in accordance with manufacturer's instructions, and to ensure optimum hair condition.

3.10 Unwanted colour reflect is counteracted in accordance with confirmed outcome.

3.11 Hair is prepared for following service.

Range may include but is not limited to – towel dried, combed, product applied.

3.12 Home haircare advice provided is consistent with hair type and completed service.

Range product type, hair maintenance.

3.13 Record card is filled out in accordance with workplace requirements.

Range client details, completed service, advice provided.

3.14 Tools and equipment are sanitised in accordance with workplace requirements.

3.15 The work area is cleaned and tidied in accordance with workplace requirements.

Range work area – shampoo area, styling station, dispensary.
