- 1.4 Lightening products are described in terms of how they are selected and matched to a variety of hair types.
- 1.5 The relevance of using toners in lightening services is described in terms of the finished result.

Range selection, products, application.

### Outcome 2

Demonstrate knowledge of the health and safety risks of lightening products.

# **Performance criteria**

2.1 The stages of the lightening process that commonly cause health and safety incidents are identified and described.

Range includes but is not limited to – compacting hair together, working with heat and chemicals, not following manufacturer's instructions.

2.2 The use of lightener is described in terms of health and safety risks.

Range risks to clients, risks to stylist.

2.3 The use of allergy tests in relation to lightening products is described.
