

Title	Straighten hair permanently using chemical processes		
Level	4	Credits	8

Purpose	<p>This unit standard is for people in the hairdressing industry who have knowledge of permanent hair waving and who wish to extend their knowledge and further develop their skills to permanently straighten naturally curly hair.</p> <p>People credited with this unit standard are able to: prepare to permanently straighten hair using chemical processes; straighten hair using chemical processes; and complete follow-up actions.</p>

Recommended skills and knowledge	Unit 2892, <i>Permanently wave hair</i> , and 28839, <i>Apply knowledge of chemical reformation techniques to assist with salon services</i> ; or demonstrate equivalent knowledge and skills.

Explanatory notes

- Definitions

Following service may include but is not limited to – haircut, blow wave.

Hair type includes but is not limited to – normal, fine, dry and/or damaged, oily, colour treated hair, coarse hair, Afro-American hair.

Legislative requirements refer to the obligations of the employer and/or employee under the Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992 and Health (Hairdressers) Regulations 1980.
- This unit standard does not include relaxing a permanent wave.
- In this unit standard all work must comply with legislative requirements and must ensure optimum hair condition and maximum client comfort at all times.
- For final assessment, a full head of hair must be permanently straightened.
- For practising the skills within this standard and to demonstrate the ability to repeat performance, evidence may include some partial heads of hair.

Outcomes and evidence requirements

Outcome 1

Prepare to permanently straighten hair using chemical processes.

Evidence requirements

- 1.1 Consultation with the client identifies and confirms work needed.
- 1.2 The hair and scalp are analysed.

Range porosity, elasticity, texture, density, length, scalp conditions, growth patterns.
- 1.3 The straightening technique selected is in accordance with hair and scalp analysis, and meets confirmed outcome.
- 1.4 The client is protected against water and/or chemical spillage.

Outcome 2

Straighten hair using chemical processes.

Evidence requirements

- 2.1 Selected hair straightening product meets confirmed outcome.
- 2.2 Hair preparation is in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.
- 2.3 The straightening product is applied in accordance with selected technique, manufacturer's instructions, and confirmed outcome.

Range includes but is not limited to – maximum application time of 30 minutes for a full head.
- 2.4 The straightening is processed in accordance with manufacturer's instructions and is monitored to achieve confirmed outcome.
- 2.5 The scalp is monitored for chemical damage.
- 2.6 Strand test confirms desired result.
- 2.7 Straightening product removal ensures maximum hair and scalp protection and is in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.
- 3.8 Hair is neutralised in accordance with manufacturer's instructions and confirmed outcome.

Outcome 3

Complete follow-up actions.

Evidence requirements

3.1 Hair is prepared for following service.

Range may include but is not limited to – towel dried, combed, product applied.

3.2 Home haircare advice provided is consistent with hair type and completed service.

Range product type, hair maintenance.

3.3 The record card is filled out in accordance with workplace requirements.

Range client details, completed service, advice provided.

3.4 Tools and equipment are sanitised in accordance with workplace requirements.

3.5 The work area is cleaned and tidied in accordance with workplace requirements.

Range work area – shampoo area, styling station, dispensary.
