- If the workplace uses artificial insemination, candidates must be able to identify and report dams which are in oestrus (on heat). Appropriate heat detection methods vary between livestock species.
- 6 Examples of management practices to stimulate oestrus dams may include flushing, use of teasers, synchronisation.
- 7 Definition
 - On-farm procedures refer to the verbal or written instructions to staff on procedures for animal care, welfare, and management.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Assist with premating preparation of livestock.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Assist with managing livestock body condition.
- 1.2 Assist with premating management practices in accordance with relevant code of welfare.
- 1.3 Recognise behaviour of female livestock when in oestrus.

Outcome 2

Assist with moving and handling livestock for mating.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Describe livestock breeding objectives in relation to mating period and use of natural and/or artificial insemination.
- 2.2 Choose livestock handling techniques appropriate for the class and reproductive stage of livestock being handled or moved.
- 2.3 Assist with livestock handling during mating in accordance with on-farm procedures and relevant code of welfare.
- 2.4 Recognise and manage risks to self and others.

Outcome 3

Assist with mating related observations and recordings.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Observe and report on the mating status of breeding livestock.
- 3.2 Record livestock mating information.

may include but not limited to oestrus, natural mating, artificial insemination, culls, pregnancy diagnosis, scanning, conception rate, submission rate, wet or dry udder assessment; evidence of at least two is required.
