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### Guidance Information

- 1 Definition  
The term *airport* refers to aerodrome as per Civil Aviation Rules.
- 2 Reference to enterprise procedures means that all activities must comply with the requirements contained in the current airport exposition, current airport company manuals and procedures, where applicable, and any relevant legislative and/or regulatory requirements, which may include but are not limited to: Civil Aviation Act 1990, relevant Civil Aviation Rules, Aviation Crimes Act 1972, Aviation Security Services Policies and Procedures, New Zealand Defence Force (NZDF) Policy.

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### Outcomes and performance criteria

#### Outcome 1

Maintain awareness of security measures and security risk at an airport.

#### Performance criteria

- 1.1 Security roles of workers in an airport are recognised in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 1.2 Security measures are applied in the workplace in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 1.3 Information about potential aviation security risks is reviewed in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 1.4 Security policies and procedures are identified, interpreted, and applied in accordance with enterprise procedures.

**Outcome 2**

Maintain security vigilance at an airport.

**Performance criteria**

- 2.1 Potential security risks are monitored during workplace activities in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 2.2 Effective communication skills are used when working with others to maintain security vigilance in accordance with enterprise procedures.

**Outcome 3**

Recognise and assess potential security risks at an airport.

**Performance criteria**

- 3.1 Factors that may affect security of an aviation workplace are identified in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 3.2 Security assessment principles are applied when potential security risks are identified, and appropriate actions are taken in accordance with enterprise procedures.

**Outcome 4**

Respond to potential security risks at an airport.

**Performance criteria**

- 4.1 Potential security risks are communicated in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 4.2 Instructions from security supervisors/managers and security procedures are followed in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 4.3 Responses to insecure access points are applied in accordance with enterprise procedures.

**Outcome 5**

Report potential security risks at an airport.

**Performance criteria**

- 5.1 Security risks are reported in a timely manner in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 5.2 Security documentation is identified and completed in accordance with enterprise procedures.
