- 2 Definition

Workplace procedures – the procedures and standards set by the client or employing organisation. Workplace procedures should reflect equipment manufacturer's requirements, and current legislation.

- 3 For the purposes of assessment:
 - evidence must be presented in accordance with workplace procedures.
 - assessment for the practical components of this unit standard must be supplied from a commercial horse.
- 4 Horses in training may include all stages of training from spelling to peak performance, letting down, during rest or injury, and when unwell at any stage during training.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of common horse feeds, nutritional and feed requirements, and feeding problems of horses in training.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Identify commonly used horse feeds by their visual characteristics.
 - Range includes but is not limited to grains, commercially processed feeds, roughage.
- 1.2 Assess quality of feeds using features of appearance, smell, touch, and taste for suitability for equine consumption.
- 1.3 Identify the types, and nutritional composition of commonly used feeds.

Range includes but is not limited to – grains, commercially processed feeds, roughage.

1.4 Describe feed processing methods.

Range evidence of at least two is required.

1.5 Describe the nutritional and feed requirements of horses in training.

Range nutritional requirements – protein, energy, roughage, vitamins, minerals, electrolytes, water; feed requirements – use of trickle feeder, routine, changing feeds gradually, quantity of feed to workload and body weight.

1.6 Describe the causes and treatment or management of feeding problems in relation to horse health.

Range may include but is not limited to – laminitis, colic, obesity, tying up, gastric ulcers, digestive disorders, respiratory infections, bolting feed, aggressive feeding behaviour, picky feeding, dropping food; evidence of six is required.

1.7 Describe good practice rules of feeding in relation to horse's health and digestion.

Range evidence of six rules is required.

Outcome 2

Feed horses in training.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Prepare, combine, and place feed in horses stable with consideration for individual horse feeding behaviour.
- 2.2 Place and/or secure hay in the stable.
- 2.3 Maintain water supply and monitor water consumption for horses.

2.4 Record and report feed consumption, feeding behaviour, and health problems related to feeding to the supervisor.
