- 2 This unit standard and unit standards 29423, and 29465 together meet the assessment requirements of ERAC EPC 49.
- 2 Definitions
 - EWRB* – Electrical Worker’s Registration Board.
 - Industry practice* – those practices that competent practitioners within the industry recognise as current industry best practice.
 - Safe and sound practice* – as it relates to the installation of electrical equipment is defined in AS/NZS 3000:2007, *Electrical Installations (known as the Australian/New Zealand Wiring Rules)*.
- 3 Range
 - a Candidates may refer to current legislation and Standards during assessment.
 - b Demonstration of safe working practices and installation in accordance with *safe and sound practice* are essential components of assessment of this unit standard.
 - c All activities and evidence presented for all outcomes and evidence requirements in this unit standard must be in accordance with:
 - i legislation;
 - ii policies and procedures;
 - iii ethical codes;
 - iv Standards – may include but are not limited to those listed in Schedule 2 of the Electricity (Safety) Regulations 2010;
 - v applicable site, enterprise, and industry practice; and,
 - vi where appropriate, manufacturers’ instructions, specifications, and data sheets.

Outcomes and evidence requirements

Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of the electrical industry ethical work practices.

Evidence requirements

- 1.1 Describe the need to uphold the standards of the electrical industry.
- 1.2 Describe work ethics and personal accountability including good time keeping.
- 1.3 Summarise community ethics, which includes dealing with multi-cultural, and personal responsibilities.
- 1.4 Describe the need for and principles of fair, right, and just dealings with people.
- 1.5 Identify the attitude, aptitude, and behaviour expected of a commercially competent electrical worker.
- 1.6 Summarise the function of the Electrical Workers Registration Board (EWRB) disciplinary processes.
- 1.7 Describe workplace practices as an employee in terms of time management, punctuality, use of electronic devices, breaks, personal appointments, absences, and deadlines.
