Purpose	<p>This unit standard is for people who work in the crew role in a quick service restaurant.</p> <p>People credited with this unit standard are able to demonstrate knowledge of company requirements, and carry out crew duties under supervision in a quick service restaurant.</p>

Establishment requirements – any policy, standard operating procedure, or agreed requirement that is made known to the candidate prior to assessment against this unit standard.
- 3 This unit standard can be assessed using simulation but must be assessed in the workplace.

Outcomes and evidence requirements

Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of establishment requirements in a quick service restaurant.

Evidence requirements

- 1.1 The establishment’s brand image is identified and described in terms of the expectations for employees.

Range includes but is not limited to – personal presentation, customer service, consistency of product.

- 1.2 Shift goals and objectives are identified and described in terms of their relationship to the employee's job requirements.

Range may include but is not limited to – product knowledge, service requirements, production requirements.

Outcome 2

Carry out crew duties under supervision in a quick service restaurant.

Evidence requirements

- 2.1 Cleaning instructions are followed in accordance with establishment requirements.
- 2.2 Shift goals and objectives are met in accordance with establishment requirements.
- 2.3 Food orders are checked and monitored in accordance with establishment requirements.

Range includes but is not limited to – giving clear instructions, providing feedback.
