- 6 Definitions

Artwork specifications may include but are not limited to artist details including – whakapapa connections, title of work, dates of construction, dimensions (length, width, height), collection details, points of interest.

*Imagery* may include but is not limited to – photographs, pictures, photocopies, videos.

*Provenance* refers to the origin of the pattern and or kete and ownership details. *Te Whare Pora* – a house or place that is set aside to teach and conserve the art of weaving.

7 Referencing

Referencing of all sources of information is encouraged. Referencing will prepare ākonga for the requirements of academic writing.
