 - Range may include but is not limited to internet, magazines, fashion stores, television, industry events, trade magazines, movies.
- 1.2 Industry trends to support the role of a beauty therapist are identified.
 - Range may include but is not limited to seasonal themes, cultural influences, international, texture, colour palette.

Outcome 2

Illustrate current trends and influences in relation to beauty therapy services.

Range services may include but are not limited to – eyebrows, eye enhancements, facials, tanning, makeup, hair removal, nails (art and shapes). a minimum of four services is required.

Evidence requirements

- 2.1 Current trends in relation to beauty services are illustrated using images.
- 2.2 Current influences are researched and illustrated.

Outcome 3

Identify and evaluate opportunities to maintain currency in the beauty therapy industry.

Evidence requirements

- 3.1 Opportunities for professional development are identified and described, and evaluated to determine availability, cost, relevance to own personal requirements, and timing.
 - Range opportunities may include but are not limited to workshops, competitions, beauty expos, guest educators, company demonstrations, one on one coaching; evidence is required of three opportunities over 12 months.
