<b>Purpose</b>	Learners credited with this unit standard are able to demonstrate understanding of a variety of spoken Vagahau Niue texts on everyday topics.

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### Guidance Information

- 1 *Vagahau Niue* refers to the authentic language of Niue as communicated in the Pacific Island nation and in New Zealand.
- 2 The title and outcome of the standard are translated in Vagahau Niue; *Fakakite e maamaaga hagao ai ke he tau tala kehekehe, mai he Vagahau Niue, mai he tau tala ke lata mo e aho.*
- 3 This unit standard is derived from the Learning Languages learning area, Communication strand, Curriculum Level 6 of *The New Zealand Curriculum*, Learning Media, Ministry of Education, 2007, and is related to the *Tau Hatakiaga ma e Vagahau Niue: The Niue Language Guidelines* (<https://pasifika.tki.org.nz/Pacific-languages/Vagahau-Niue>) and the material in the *Teaching and Learning Guide for Languages*, Ministry of Education at <https://seniorsecondary.tki.org.nz/>.
- 4 It is recommended that:
  - i the outcomes are assessed as part of an integrated unit of work, relevant to the learning context of the learner;
  - ii assessment be conducted in conjunction with assessment against other Vagahau Niue unit standards at this level.

- 5 Each spoken text for this unit standard:
- i is up to one minute in length;
  - ii a minimum of three different text types is required which may include but not limited to – short conversations, voice messages, podcasts, announcements, short media reports;
  - iii must be appropriate to the spoken manner or a text which is designed for oral delivery;
  - iv must be delivered in clear standard speech in a familiar accent;
  - v may include distinct and differentiated voices, for example, female and male, youthful and mature;
  - vi may be heard as a whole, and in sections, with a pause after each section;
  - vii may be presented face to face, or in pre-recorded audio or audio-visual format. If audio-visual materials are used, these must not include large amounts of written text.

- 7 Definitions
- Everyday topics* refer to the learner's personal life and past, present and/or future experiences – tau tala he haaku a moui, for example magafaoa (family), tau fakafetuiaga he magafaoa (family relationships), feua sipote (sports), tau tufuga (arts and crafts), fakatau mena kai (buying food), kaina (home), talahauaga ke he tau matakavi (local places), tau fakafiafiaaga (celebrations).
- Spoken manner* refers to voice modulation, voice projection, tone, pace, pause for dramatic effect, articulation, use of space, enunciation, stance, non-verbal cues.
- Variety* refers to texts selected from a range of different text types which have been created and/or sourced for different audiences and purposes.

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## Outcomes and performance criteria

### Outcome 1

Demonstrate understanding of a variety of spoken Vagahau Niue texts on everyday topics.

### Performance criteria

- 1.1 A response to each text is given in either English, te reo Māori and/or Vagahau Niue that shows understanding by making meaning of the information, ideas and/or opinions in the texts.
- Range a response may include but is not limited to – clarifying information, ideas and/or opinions; summarising information, annotating, amending, producing, or completing visual representations of ideas e.g., maps, sketches, diagrams.
