- 2 Vagahau Niue refers to the authentic language of Niue as communicated in the Pacific Island nation and in New Zealand.

- 7 Definitions

Abstract matters are based on general ideas rather than on real things and events, for example – fakaalofa (love), fakafetuiaga he hoana moe taane (marriage), kautu he gahua (success), atā ina (freedom), mitaki (good), mahani fakatokolalo (humility), mahani tututonu (morality), justice, democracy, fakalilifu (respect), fakamonuina (blessings), tonu (fair).

Concrete matters refers to objects or events that are available to the senses, for example – sipunu (spoon), laulau (table), talo, umu, vela (hot), lakahui (walking), pelē lakapi (rugby match), pelē netepolo (netball game), mau hoana (wedding ceremony) or tau mau he vahā tuai (traditional type wedding).

Extended refers to developed texts on both concrete and abstract matters. This may include texts that express a point of view on a subject with supporting evidence.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Demonstrate understanding of a variety of extended written Vagahau Niue texts.

Range minimum of three different text types is required.

Performance criteria

1.1 A response to each text is given in either English, te reo Māori and/or Vagahau Niue that demonstrates understanding by making meaning of the information and varied perspectives from the texts.

Range

a response may include – clarifying information, ideas and/or opinions; summarising information, ideas and/or opinions; producing, annotating, amending, or completing visual representations of ideas e.g., maps, sketches, diagrams.
