2 Definition

Agrichemical is any substance, whether inorganic or organic, man-made or naturally occurring, modified or in its original state, that is used to eradicate, modify or control flora and fauna. It is a subset of agricultural compounds and includes pesticides, spray additives, and foliar fertilisers.

Agrichemical formulation is an agrichemical preparation supplied by the manufacturer.

1.1 Interpret agrichemical product information for agrichemical use according to product labels, product safety cards or safety data sheets.

Range information may include but is not limited to – hazard

response, disposal of unused product and containers;

evidence of eight information items is required.

1.2 Describe the relevance of withholding periods in relation to production activities.
