Nursery crop refers to a crop of no less than 50 plants. *Workplace procedures* refer to policies and procedures on safety, operation, and production set down by the employer or host organisation for propagation of cuttings.

- 3 Examples of cutting types leaf cuttings, root cuttings, and stem cuttings (stem cuttings may include hardwood cuttings, semi-hardwood cuttings, softwood cuttings).
- 4 All evidence presented in this unit standard must be in accordance with workplace procedures.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Select and prepare cutting material for nursery crops.

Range evidence of two different plant species of 50 plants each, using two different cutting types is required.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Select and remove cutting material from stock plants.
- 1.2 Store cutting material before processing.

- 1.3 Make cuttings and apply suitable cutting treatment.
- 1.4 Select rooting medium, container or open ground, and propagation environment.
- 1.5 Set cuttings to a depth and spacing appropriate for growth and cutting type.
- 1.6 Select propagation environment to maximise root development and cutting survival.
- 1.7 Identify and label propagated plant material.
- 1.8 Identify and report damage, wear or malfunction of tools and equipment.
- 1.9 Maintain records of selection and preparation of cutting material.

Outcome 2

Harden off rooted cuttings.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Monitor and maintain cuttings for optimum plant and root development.
- 2.2 Harden off rooted cuttings and remove to growing-on area.
- 2.3 Maintain records of environmental maintenance and monitoring procedures for cuttings.
