Purpose	People credited with this unit standard are able to deliver an impromptu speech in Vagahau Niue.

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Guidance Information

- 1 Evidence is required from an impromptu speech delivered by the learner to an audience, on a familiar topic provided by the assessor just prior to speech preparation. The learner should have a choice of topics such as describing an exciting moment, talking about an experience, explaining a simple process. The learner must have no more than five minutes preparation time and is expected to speak for three to five minutes.
- 2 Achievement of the evidence requirements allows for few minor errors in grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation and intonation. Minor errors must not obscure the meaning.
- 3 Definitions
 - Audience* refers to three or more persons.
 - Complex* refers to a wide range of vocabulary and tenses in sentences containing one or more dependent clauses, and complicated grammatical structures.
 - Intonation* refers to appropriate sound pattern of words, phrases, and sentences through pitch variation.
 - Pronunciation* refers to accurate expression of vowels and consonants.
 - Vagahau Niue* refers to the authentic Niue language.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Deliver an impromptu speech in Vagahau Niue.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Impromptu speech is delivered clearly in Vagahau Niue.
 - Range pronunciation and intonation.
- 1.2 Complex vocabulary and language is used that is consistent with the topic and audience.

- 1.3 Meaning that is consistent with the topic is conveyed through pacing in delivery of words, phrases and sentences.
