

<b>Title</b>	<b>Deliver an impromptu speech in Vagahau Niue</b>

<b>Purpose</b>	Learners credited with this unit standard are able to deliver an impromptu speech in Vagahau Niue.
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<b>Classification</b>	Languages > Vagahau Niue
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<b>Available grade</b>	Achieved
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### Guidance Information

- 1 *Vagahau Niue* refers to the authentic language of Niue as communicated in the Pacific Island nation and in New Zealand.
- 2 The title and outcome of the standard are translated in Vagahau Niue; *Tu hake ke fono, fakakite tau manatu*.
- 3 Evidence is required from an impromptu speech delivered by the learner to an audience, on a familiar topic. The learner should have a choice of topics such as describing an exciting moment, talking about an experience, and explaining a simple process. The learner must have no more than ten minutes preparation time and is expected to speak for three to five minutes.
- 4 Achievement of the performance criteria allows for minor inaccuracies in grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation and intonation. Minor errors must not obscure the meaning.

- 6 Definitions  
*Audience* refers to two or more persons. This could be either a face-to-face or online audience.  
*Clearly* for this standard refers to using spoken Vagahau Niue that is free from confusion and ambiguity.  
*Complex* refers to a wide range of vocabulary and tenses in sentences containing one or more dependent clauses, and complicated grammatical structures.  
*Intonation* refers to the appropriate sound pattern of words, phrases and sentences.  
*Pronunciation* refers to accurate expression of vowels and consonants.

## Outcomes and performance criteria

### Outcome 1

Deliver an impromptu speech in Vagahau Niue.

### Performance criteria

- 1.1 Impromptu speech is delivered clearly in Vagahau Niue.  
Range pronunciation and intonation.
- 1.2 Complex vocabulary and language is used that is consistent with the topic and audience.
- 1.3 Meaning that is consistent with the topic is conveyed through pacing in delivery of words, phrases and sentences.
