3 Definition

Ethics – that which is right, fair, just, and good in terms of conduct that guides behaviour in the roofing industry. Ethics provide a basis for assessing the morality of a situation, decision, or outcome.

4 Range

- a Candidates must refer to current legislation and Standards during assessment.
- b Demonstration of safe working practices are essential components of assessment of this unit standard.
- c All activities and evidence presented for all outcomes and performance criteria in this unit standard must be in accordance with:
 - i legislation;
 - ii policies and procedures;
 - iii ethical codes;
 - iv Standards – may include but are not limited to those cited in the New Zealand Building Code Hand Book;
 - v applicable site, enterprise, and industry practice; and,
 - vi manufacturers' instructions, specifications, and data sheets.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of the roofing industry ethical work practices.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Describe the need to uphold the standards of the roofing industry.
- 1.2 Describe work ethics and personal accountability, including good time keeping.
- 1.3 Explain ethical conduct in terms of respect for customers' privacy, property, and personal values.
- 1.4 Describe the need for and principles of fair, right, and just dealings with people.
- 1.5 Identify the attitude, aptitude, and behaviour expected of a commercially competent roofing worker.
- 1.6 Describe workplace practices as an employee in terms of time management, punctuality, use of electronic devices, breaks, personal appointments, absences, and deadlines.
- 1.7 Explain skills maintenance and how it can be achieved.

Outcome 2

Work with other trades and stakeholders in the construction industry.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Communicate with stakeholders including clients and manager to ensure the project meets specification requirements.
- 2.2 Work with other trades to ensure all activities are carried out in a logical sequence and in a safe manner.
- 2.3 Lead a community, tailgate, or toolbox meeting.
