  - c All activities and evidence presented for all outcomes and performance criteria in this unit standard must be in accordance with:
    - i legislation;
    - ii policies and procedures;
    - iii ethical codes;
    - iv Standards may include but are not limited to those cited in the New Zealand Building Code Hand Book;
    - v applicable site, enterprise, and industry practice; and,
    - vi manufacturers' instructions, specifications, and data sheets.

### Outcomes and performance criteria

#### Outcome 1

Demonstrate knowledge of the health and safety requirements for a roofing worksite.

#### Performance criteria

1.1 Summarise terms as defined in the Health and Safety at Work Act.

Range notifiable event, notifiable incident, notifiable injury or illness, reasonably practicable, supply, workplace.

- 1.2 Describe the functions, rights, and responsibilities of employers, employees, officers, PCBUs, and workers in accordance with the Health and Safety at Work Act.
- 1.3 Explain the principal health and safety system requirements for roofing worksites.
  - Range principal systems include but are not limited to emergency procedures, training, employee participation, incident and hazard reporting, hazard management.
- 1.4 Define hazards as described in the Health and Safety at Work Act.
- 1.5 Explain the hazard management controls and hierarchy in terms of eliminating and minimising hazards and give two examples of each.

#### Outcome 2

Demonstrate knowledge of roofing work safety requirements.

#### Performance criteria

- 2.1 Describe notifiable work activities and procedures relevant to roofing work in accordance with WorkSafe requirements.
- 2.2 Describe work area cordons, safety notices, and notification of work signs in accordance with site procedures.
- 2.3 Identify hot work associated with roofing and describe hot work in terms of management, precautions to observe, and hot work permit limitations and requirements.
- 2.4 Describe the potential long-term effects of ill health and injuries on yourself, your family, your workplace, and the wider community.
- 2.5 Explain the main considerations and requirements for working at heights.
  - Range scaffolding; edge protection; mechanical access plant; safety mesh; harness systems; temporary work platforms (twps); catch platforms; soft landing systems (slss); safety nets; fixed roof ladders and crawl boards; ladders, stepladders, and means of access.
- 2.6 Identify common hazards that can impact on working at height.

Range evidence of five common hazards is required.

- 2.7 Describe procedures to follow when walking on roof framing and on finished roof.
- 2.8 Describe methods for moving roofing materials and machinery on a roofing work site.

#### Outcome 3

Maintain a safe roofing workplace environment.

#### **Performance criteria**

- 3.1 Carryout work practices without injury to people or damage to equipment, building, or plant.
- 3.2 Select and wear personal protective equipment for the task-at-hand in accordance with manufacturers' instructions and site procedures.
  - Range includes but is not limited to hard hat, sun block, ear muffs, safety glasses, gloves, knee pads, high-visibility clothing, safety harness.
- 3.3 Cordon off work area and distribute and/or erect safety notices and notifications of work signs in accordance with site procedures.

- 3.4 Maintain work area clear of debris and unnecessary equipment.
- 3.5 Confirm availability of site-specific safety plan.
  - Range safety plan may include but is not limited to hazard identification, working at height, securing loose material, material safety data.
