

<b>Title</b>	<b>Use small machinery to carry out a range of routine tasks under close supervision in meat processing operations</b>

<b>Purpose</b>	<p>This unit standard is for people working under close supervision in a meat processing context.</p> <p>People credited with this unit standard are able to use small machinery to carry out routine tasks in meat processing operations.</p>

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### Explanatory notes

- 1 Evidence requirements must be consistent with all relevant legislation and subsequent amendments; this includes but is not limited to:
  - Workplace procedures
  - Health and Safety at Work Act 2015
  - Animal Products Act 1999.
- 2 Definition
 

*Workplace procedures* refer to policies and procedures on safety and operation set down by the employer or host organisation when working on a meat processing operation.
- 3 Evidence is required for at least 3 types of machinery.  
 Small machinery may include – rack machine, loading machine, vacuum machine, gas flushing machine, tripe bleaching and washing machine, carton making machine, lidder, metal detection machine.  
 Small machinery excludes – hand held cutting equipment, bandsaws, skinning machine.

### Outcomes and evidence requirements

#### Outcome 1

Use small machinery to carry out a range of routine tasks under close supervision in meat processing operations.

#### Evidence Requirements

- 1.1 Check machinery for safety and functionality prior to use.

- 1.2 Operate and monitor machinery effectively, efficiently, safely, and according to manufacturer's operating instructions.
- 1.3 Maintain safe work practices while operating machinery.
- 1.4 Clean and store machinery after use according to manufacturer's instructions.
- 1.5 Use personal protective equipment as required.
- 1.6 Report workplace information and/or any problems relating to small machinery and its use.
