Environment refers to where kuta grows.

Location refers to where kuta to be harvested is located.

Quality ensures kuta is graded to complete a kete.

Quantity ensures enough kuta is prepared to complete a kete.

Seasonal refers to when kuta is harvested.

Size refers to whenu width and length.

Te Whare Pora – a house or place that is set aside to teach and conserve the art of weaving.

7 Referencing

Referencing of all sources of information is encouraged.

Referencing will prepare akonga for the requirements of academic writing.

Identify the natural habitat of kuta.

- 3.1 Preparation processes are recorded.
- 3.2 Kuta are flattened to produce the desired state for usage.
- 3.3 Kuta are bundled in a manner that ensures minimal damage.
- 3.4 Kuta is stored.
