- 4 Definitions

Appropriate harakeke is more easily recognisable by its stiff upright blades rather than the others that are softer and droopy.

Imagery may include but is not limited to – photographs, pictures, photocopies, videos.

Quality ensures weaving resource is graded to complete wahakura. Includes but is not limited to – broken, infected or discoloured whenu.

Size refers to whenu width and length.

Te Whare Pora – a house or place that is set aside to teach and conserve the art of weaving.

Wahakura – for the purpose of this standard refers to a basket for holding pepe, woven using a whiri base. 'Waha' is to carry, and 'kura' is precious taonga.

5 Referencing

Referencing of all sources of information is encouraged. Referencing will prepare ākonga for the requirements of academic writing.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Research wahakura.

Range all research to include referencing of information.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Whakapapa of wahakura and its usage is researched.
- 1.2 Safe sleeping rules for wahakura are researched.

Outcome 2

Prepare harakeke for wahakura.

Performance criteria

2.1 Identify and harvest *appropriate harakeke* to complete wahakura.

Range quality, size; three separate whiri; using a minimum of 72 whenu at 12mm in width, or the equivalent to fit a standard approved bassinet mattress of approximately 750mm x 350mm x 40mm.

2.2 Prepare whenu to complete wahakura.

Outcome 3

Raranga wahakura using takitahi pattern.

Range wahakura to be woven with shiny side on the inside, and dull side on the outside; external height of sides must not exceed 16cm; whiri must lay on exterior of wahakura.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Wahakura is completed using three separate whiri.
- 3.2 Wahakura is completed with minimal gaps.
- 3.4 Base is secured and locked before weaving side walls.
- 3.4 Top of wahakura is finished using tapiki whiri.
