- 1.2 Undertake snowboarder movement analysis, identify key areas for improvement, and describe appropriate suggestions of how to enhance the learners boarding skills.
- 1.3 Describe and demonstrate progressions for beginner snowboarders.
- 1.4 Apply teaching methods, practices and models to provide learner appropriate snowboarding instruction for beginners up to and including linked skidded turns.
