- 2 Definitions

Alternative snowsport discipline is a snowsport discipline that is new to the learner and which they do not instruct. Disciplines can include ski, board, adaptive, telemark, park, freestyle or race.

Organisational policies and procedures are instructions to staff that may be documented and available for reference at each alpine facility or snowschool in the form of an operations manual and/or policy and procedures manual.
- 3 The learner must participate as a beginner in an alternative snowsport discipline to gain beginner competence and current experience of being a learner, where their focus is on the experience of being a learner for the purposes of informing their own instructional practice.

Reflect on own learning experience in an alternative snowsport discipline to inform own instruction practice.

- 1.1 Reflect on own experience as a snowsport learner in an alternative discipline in relation to barriers and enablers to own learning.
